In the last three years. Knotts has raised more than \$200,000 for the Delaware Breast Cancer Coalition, a nonprofit with a mission to raise awareness about breast issues in order to facilitate early detection and treatment of breast cancer. She did it by looking around her house. She called the companies that made any product or service she used and liked. With what she called tasteful persistence, she usually ended up with a donation of $\underline{\text{money}}$ or goods that could be auctioned.

"I call CEOs," she said. "People, really, if you just work with them and try, they have good hearts."

Items her efforts have garnered include round-trip airfares on Southwest Airlines, a new mountain bike from the manufacturer, a wine selection from her favorite California vineyard and a pet gift basket from the maker of her dog's biscuits. Raising funds to help people with breast cancer has become Knotts' full-time volunteer job. In fact, she quit her job as the head of the information technology department at the DuPont Experimental Station to have more time for the cause. It's because of this dedication and her fabulous results that Knotts was nominated for a Jefferson Award, according to Michael Ryan, a friend who nominated her.

"I just enjoy volunteering," said Knotts, who got involved after her mother died of breast cancer six years ago. She said she became depressed and wanted to help others and hopefully help create more survivors. "Breast cancer really touches a lot of people."

Of all the items she's had donated over the years, probably the best is her sister's talent. Knotts' sister, Bev Michel, is a master photographer who creates and donates portraits of the models for the annual "Northern Lights of Life: An Evening of Living and Giving!" fashion show fundraiser held every September at Longwood Gardens. All the models are breast cancer survivors.
